Subject: "IMO DCS: Deadline Approaching for Annual Submission of Fuel Oil Consumption Data (31/03/2021)"

Scope:

This Marine Circular aims to remind all interested parties operating ships registered in the International Ship Register of Gabon of the requirement for timely submission (31/03/2021) of an annual fuel consumption report for each calendar year, as per applicable IMO Regulations. This Marine Circular should be read in conjunction with Gabon MARCIR 09/2020, dated 25.04.2020.1

IMO DCS - Issuance of Statement of Compliance - Reporting Data for Verification

As prescribed by I.S.R. of Gabon MARCIR. 09/2020, from 2020 onwards, ship operators 1. of ships of 5,000 GT and above engaged in international shipping are required to submit annual

fuel oil consumption data to a Recognized Organization nominated by the Flag. Now with the second Data Collection System (DCS) reporting year recently ended, it is again time for reporting data on fuel oil consumption to the appointed RO, acting as DCS verifier. To ensure a Statement of Compliance (SoC) is issued in due time before 31 May 2021 as required, the deadline in MARPOL for reporting 2020 data for verification is 31 March 2021.

2. As prescribed by MARCIR. 09/2020 Regulation 22A of MARPOL Annex VI requires ships to collect and report data on their fuel consumption following a yearly cycle. Compliance is evident through the SoC issued annually on behalf of the flag of Gabon, confirming that the required data for the previous year was submitted in accordance with the methodology and process in the ship's SEEMP (Ship Energy Efficiency Management Plan).

Fuel Consumption Data Submission

3. For ships to which this regulation applies2, it is important that a valid SoC is readily available on board for inspection, together with the Confirmation of Compliance (CoC) for the SEEMP Part II. The CoC (SEEMP Part II) and the validity of the Statement of Compliance, SoC (DCS) will be checked at each periodical statutory survey. It is strongly advised to all interested parties to submit for the reporting year 2020 data to the appointed verifier, as soon as possible, at the latest on 31 March 2021, to ensure that an SoC is issued on time before 31 May 2021 as required.³

Application

- 4. This alert applies, as already indicated to all ships of 5,000 gross tonnage and above, including ships that may have been registered with or de-registered from the Gabonese flag during the calendar year for which the fuel consumption data submission is being prepared. In situations where a ship is under repair or conversion, or in extended lay-up, or remains otherwise out of active operations during the entire year, the requirements of this alert apply should the ship have consumed and/or bunkered any quantity of fuel during the year
- 5. The "Company" 4 shall ensure that fuel consumption data for the previous year for ships to which Regulation 22A of MARPOL Annex VI applies is submitted to the Reporting

Organization by not later than 31 March. The Statement of Compliance required by Regulation 6.7 of MARPOL Annex VI is to be issued by the Reporting Organization by 31 May each year. This data should be collected in accordance with the methodology described in the ship's approved Ship Energy Efficiency Management Plan (SEEMP) Part II, and submitted with supporting evidence, to enable verification in line with Resolution MEPC.292(71).

EU MRV reporting to THETIS⁵

6. Equally important and not to be forgotten is the EU MRV reporting, in addition to the DCS reporting for vessels calling at EU ports. <u>By 30 April 2021</u>, companies need to submit the verified MRV Emissions Report to the EU Commission (THETIS). To ensure timely verification, companies should submit their MRV Emissions Reports for verification no later than 31 March 2021⁶

Recommendation to shipowners/managers

7. Considering the existing international regulatory requirements and the respective Port State Control relevance of the issue at hand, the IS.R. of Gabon strongly recommends early submission of DCS data by 31 March 2021 at the latest. If there are any outstanding issues for any reason concerning the data reporting for 2020, or other reasons to believe that the SoC will not be issued before the deadline, the I.S.R. OF Gabon encourages ship owners/managers to contact their DCS verifier to avoid becoming non-compliant on 1 June 2021.
